<p>1) From: skratze@bgnet.bgsu.edu (Sheila Kratzer) Andrew John Cusaac and Jane Moore married abt 1778, Ireland</p> <p>2) "John Cusaac, the father, and Andrew Cusaac, his eldest son were granted U.S. Citizenship in 1802 according to records found in the Prothonotary's Office in Mifflin Co. John received his papers Aug 12, 1802 and Andrew was admitted on Oct 9, 1802. In one case the name was spelled Cusack, and in the other, Cussack. Virginia Schultz, of Delaware, Ohio (now deceased) told me in 1982 that the father of Andrew Cusaac (1779-1856) was also named Andrew, according to old Bible records in her possession. This could have been the case and the above John Cusaac's real name was Andrew John Cusaac. He evidently decided early on to be John Cusaac so as to eliminate confusion with the son's name of Andrew Cusaac. This, of course, would not have been at all unusual; and was done in many families which used the same given names over and over. It appears to me that Andrew John Cusaac and his wife Jane Moore Cusaac came to Pennsylvania from Ireland ca 1785. It had to be after the Revolutionary War- otherwise he and son Andrew would not have needed Citizenship Papers. We know that they were here by January, 1790 when Daniel was born in Mifflin Co. According to Virginia Schultz's records Jane Moore Cusaac was born in Scotland and came to Ireland where she met Andrew John Cusaac. They married ca 1777; and their first son Andrew was born there in 1779. Very probably their daughter Mary was also born there. The rest of the children were born in Pennsylvania." 2) "At the time of the 1820 Census Jane Moore Cusaac was living with her son Andrew Cusaac so she must have died after 1820. On the lot near the Andrew Cusaac stone in Unity Church Cemetery there are two "bases" on which there are no longer any readable markers. Andrew John Cusaac and his wife Jane Moore Cusaac may very well be buried there. It would seem logical to look into the Moore family history, since it may lead us to a location in Ireland where both families lived ca 1760-1780. Rev. Thomas Moore was minister of the Unity Presbyterian Church when it was founded in 1816. Jane Moore Cusaac, Andrew Cusaac and his wife Jane Shaw Cusaac, Daniel Cusaac and his wife Sarah Sellars Cusaac; and Jane (Jennie) Cusaac (sister of Andrew and Daniel) all became members that same year- 1816. They might be called Charter members. Four of the Rodmans also joined in 1816, thus forming the core of the church, along with many of the Moore families." Obituary..Hancock Courier 16 May 1867 Page 3

Died--At his residence in Liberty Tp., on Monday, April 22 of Typhoid Fever, Mr. Daniel Cusac, in the 78th year of his age. The deceased had been a resident of this county for almost twenty-five years. He was a man of irreproachable character, and always had the respect and good will of his neighbors. None knew him but to respect him and he was most loved by those who knew him best. In fact he was what the poet so happily describes as "the noblest work of God," and "honest man." He was a regular member and communicant of the Presbyterian Church for more than fifty years, and died in the full faith of the purifying efficacy of the Christian religion. He leaves a family of nine children (among whom is Hon. I. Cusac, our present Representative.) to mourn his departure from their midst.

"Another "son" was born later (1812) also in Pennsylvania. this was William whom we find later in Muskingum and Perry counties in Ohio, along with Andrew, John B., Daniel, and the two girls Jane Cusaac Martin and Mary Cusaac Rodman. William, I believe, was really the son of one of the girls- probably Mary who later married James Rodman. This was not uncommon for a child, so born, to be raised as a brother to the rest of the children."
