Volume I Page 14 (I think Jamie, my darling granddaughter, will be very interested to know that she did descend from a Princess.)

"The family of Pearsall did not exist until the twelfth century when Robert Fitz Gilbert de Corbeil, have acquired the manor of Peshale, vested the same in his son Robert who began to call himself de Peshale after the name of this manor. This Robert de Peshale married Ormunda de Lumley de Stafford, a princess of the royal line of Bernician-Northumbrian kings."

This list begins with the American Genearch, Edmond Pearsall who came to America in the seventeenth century and they all without exception spelled the family name as Pearsall when they reached the New World. Some descendants of these first emigrants have made many departures from the common and original way their several ancestors spelled the family name. (I haven't been able to find the word "genearch" in the three dictionaries that I have, but I spelled it here as it is written in the book. kk)

Mary Frances Pearsall [5] daughter of Edgar W. Pearsall [504] Volume III, Chapter Section 4 Page 1284 married Mathias L. Bittell [4] (Katherine Bittell Krauth's grandparents, Great Grandparents to Martin Glen Wilson Krauth, G-G-Grandparents to Jamie & Ella Krauth, daughters of Martin Glen Wilson Krauth)

Note: Mary Pearsall [542] daughter of Nathaniel Pearsall [528] Volume III Chapter Twenty-seven 1208 & Section Z Page 1212-1214 gives an interesting account of being stolen by the Indians. She had a son and when he had grown to young manhood, he returned to the Indians as a doctor.
