<p>"The surname Judd is one of the oldest English surnames and is identical with Jude, an old and now almost obsolete personal name. Judson and Judkins are formed from the same name.(For more on this, see print out in the black notebook under Thomas Judd, Connecticut, 1600S-1800S Local Families and Histories New England Families, Vol. IV Genealogies and Memorials, Page 1744)</p> <p>Deacon Thomas Judd, immigrant ancestor, came from England in 1633-34, and settled at Cambridge, Massachusetts, where he had a home lot granted to him in August, 1634. It was in the part of the town known as the West End, on the road to Watertown. He had other land granted in 1635, and was admitted a freeman May 25 of that year. He removed to Hartford, Connecticut in 1636, and had two acres for a home lot, near the Charter Oak. He was one of the first proprietors and settlers of Farmington, Connecticut, and removed there from Hartford about 1644. His home lot was on the main street, and he was a substantial farmer and an influential man. He was deputy to the general court several times. He was a charter member of the Farmington church, and was its second deacon. He died November 12, 1688, aged about eight. His first wife died in Farmington, and he married (second) December 2, 1679, Clemence Mason, widow of Thomas Mason of Northampton and resided in</p>

## Research Notes: Child - Sergant William Judd [486]

"Sergeant William Judd, son of Deacon Thomas Judd, married Marcy 30 1658, Mary, daughter of John and Rachel Steele, of Farmington; she died October 27, 1718, aged about eighty. He lived in Farmington, and was counted a well-to-do citizen for those days. The inventory of his estate was presented November 5, 1690. His age when he died was bout fifty-five years. ## General Notes: Child - Benjamin Judd [475]

It was during the ministry of Mr. Hooker, and the interim to the ordination of Rev. Samuel Whitman, 1706, that the families in the "southeastern boundary" of Farmington at a place called "Great Swamp," walked with their children in their arms, some eight or ten miles to attend the public worship of God in Farmington village, the men with well loaded guns in front and rear of the company. It shows how much they desired the sincere milk of the word. It affords a striking evidence of their zeal for religion, and that the word and ordinances, were indeed precious in those days.

Richard Seymour and others began this settlement about A. D.

at a place now called "Chrisan Lane." Here stood the Seymour Fort, or Palisades, within which the cabins were constructed, and to which all the settlers repaired at nightfall, for safety against the Indians, and for quiet rest. The well at which they quenched their thirst, still furnishes the best water. It was dug in the center of the fort. Stephen Lee had a grant by the town A. D. 1689, of five roods of land, on the west side of the highway, provided it doth not hinder former grants and the watering place.

Sergeant Benjamin Judd was located some sixty rods north of Captain Stephen Lee, where now (1862,) Richard Judd owns. Joseph Smith, senior, was a neighbor about half a mile south of Captain Lee, and all on the east street. Isaac Lewis had his house where now, (1862,) stands the house of John Ellis. It was said to be the oldest within the present limits of the town of New Britain, and Robert Boothe, senior, had his home next west where now, (1862,) Enoch Kelsey is located. Deacon Anthony Judd where William Ellis lives; John Woodruff near that little grove east of the alms house, the highway to it long since sold and shut up. Daniel Dewey a few rods south of Deacon Anthony Judd. Thomas North, (ancestor of our North families,) the Seymours and Gilberts clustered about the Stockade. Dr. Joseph Steele, the Standleys, Rootes, Harts, Nortons, Cowles or Coles, Nehemiah Porter, Joseph Lankton, Newel, Gridley, Bronsons, were located south of the Palisades, making some fourteen families in all. This valley upon which these pioneers settled was a rich alluvial soil, and might be termed bottom land. The chief objection was its being too low, hence its name "Great Swamp." It was part of the hunting grounds of the Mattabesett tribe of Indians, and tradition says their lodge or settlement was at the place called now and has been for many years, "Beckley quarter." \super (+)\nosupersub Their Trail passed near the "Seamer Fort," past "half-way Hill" to Tunxis, with which tribe they

Adm. of the estate of Benjamin Judd, is decd. Adm is granted to Benjamin Judd, his son and to John Judd, who with William Lewis are to take care for the Dispose of the children.

Page 41; 13 April 1692 invt. estate of Benjamin Judd & Mary Judd, distrubted to eldest son oe 70, to the other two, to each oe 35, to the 4 daughters, 2 each oe32-18-00; oe 10 left with adms. to bring up the youngest child till he is fit to put into service.

Page 139 (Vol IV) 4 March 1691-7 held in adjornment, 13 April 1692, Adms was granted to John & Benjamin Judd upon the estate of Benjamin & Mary Judd of Farmington, the adms. request that "William Lewis be joyned with them and impower them to put out the youngest son to good service."
